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Best Practice: Document with M.E.A.T.

M.E.A.T. Documentation Keywords:

Assessment	<u>Plan</u>
Stable	Monitor
Improved	D/C meds
Tolerating meds	Continue meds
Deteriorating	Refer to / Followed by

Examples:

- Moderate recurrent MDD pt stable with current meds, encouraged patient to see counselor for therapy
- Patient with mild single MDD doing well, will continue to monitor for worsening symptoms.



Depression Key Points

Indicate the appropriate status/episode (single or recurrent) for the patient

Include the severity level and any complications they are experiencing

Documentation Tips:

- When documenting MDD you need to indicate the status, severity, and any associated conditions or manic/psychotic episodes.
 - Single, recurrent episode, or in remission (full or partial).
 - Mild, moderate, or severe, with or without psychotic features.
- ❑Document the signs and symptoms the patient is experiencing to appropriate capture the severity of condition
- Specify current medications, or changes in medications, as this can indicate recurrent over single episode
- ✓Unspecified depression (F32.9) should only be reported if it is <u>situational</u> or <u>reactive</u> depression not requiring therapeutic intervention or medication



Episode & Status Identifiers

Single Episode	Recurrent Episode
No evidence of nrior enisodes first occurrence	At least 2 previous episodes that lasted at least 2 weeks and were separated by several months

In Remission (occurs while being treated)

Partial Remission:

- Diminished symptoms
- Complete resolution of symptoms < 2 months

Full remission:

Complete resolution of symptoms > 2 months

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Keeping Compliant Documentation

- Sompleteness and accuracy is always our goal! Solution → Completeness and accuracy is always our goal!
- Never document or bill diagnoses that are not present or currently being treated
- Never up-code diagnoses to achieve a higher risk score
- ■Do not document a resolved or historical medical condition as current if it is no longer being treated
- Correct any errors in diagnoses previously reported or that no longer apply
- Keep accurate, specific problem lists to easily pull the most appropriate codes into encounter notes

▲Avoid using abbreviations unless the condition is previously established in the documentation within the same OV note.
